## Prerequisites and Reminders

1. Must be a U.S. Citizen capable of obtaining a Top Secret security clearance.
2. Possess a bachelor's degree from an accredited college (or within one semester of earning a degree)
3. You must not be over the age of 31 on 01 October 2019.
4. Vision Requirements:
  - a. The vision requirement is no worse than a refraction error greater than +2.00 or -3.00. If you have had LASIK/PRK surgery you may be eligible to apply after 6 months has passed since your surgery. The height requirement is between 64 inches and 77 inches tall.
5. Must have taken and received the results from the following tests:
  - Air Force Officer Qualifying Test (AFOQT).  
Minimum scores: Pilot 25, Verbal 15, Quantitative 10  
To schedule the AFOQT, contact the Force Development office at the 128<sup>th</sup> Air Refueling Wing at (414) 944-8436 or the Recruiting office at the 128<sup>th</sup> Air Refueling Wing at (414) 944-8570.
  - Test of Basic Aviation Skills (TBAS). To schedule a TBAS test go to <https://access.afpc.af.mil/pcsmdmz/index.html> or call SMSgt Galik, (414) 944-8436. Once AFOQT and TBAS is complete you will be able to access the PCSM score.

The hiring board will take place in November 2019. Packets are due 31 August 2019. Selected applicants can expect to attend pilot training in Fiscal Year 2021 (Oct 2020 - Sep 2021). Training may start earlier or later due to unforeseen circumstances.

If selected as a candidate for undergraduate flying training, you will be required to establish a permanent residence within 75 miles of General Mitchell Air National Guard Base (Milwaukee, WI) upon satisfactory completion of pilot training.

6. Submit a copy of your private pilot's license, any certifications, and flight logs with aircraft type (if applicable).
7. Forms to submit: AF Form 24, AF IMT 2030 and DD Form 2807-2 (you can google these forms or contact the 128<sup>th</sup> Recruiting Office at 414-944-8433).
8. Letters of recommendation (3 Maximum)

### - Duties and Responsibilities

- Plans and prepares for mission. Reviews mission tasking, intelligence, and weather information. Supervises mission planning, preparation, filing a flight plan, and crew briefing. Ensures aircraft is inspected, loaded, equipped, and manned for mission.
- Pilots aircraft and commands crew. Operates aircraft controls and equipment. Performs, supervises, or directs navigation, in-flight refueling, and cargo and passenger delivery.
- Conducts or supervises training of crewmembers. Ensures operational readiness of crew by conducting or supervising mission specific training.
- Develops plans and policies, monitors operations, and advises commanders. Assists commanders and performs staff functions related to this specialty.
